WHAT CATHOLICS WANT TO KNOW

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

The gospel reading for this Sunday is not only the first miracle in John's gospel—it is also the first mention of Jesus' Mother. I used to find it odd that He addressed her as "Woman." But in that time the word was more respectful; it could even be affectionate. Jesus does help as His mother requested, but He did so in a way that was a lesson about God's love.

You have probably heard how the Jewish people in Jesus' time used ritual purifications before eating anything. The cleansings were a sign that they wanted to be like God, completely free from sin. Eventually, it came to mean that you could not approach God until you cleansed yourself. Jesus could have made the wine in bottles or wine skins. But He used the "six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings." (Jn 2:6) That means that once they were full of wine, no one could wash themselves from the jars. I wonder how many Pharisees flipped out when they saw that.

The point of this is that no one can cleanse themselves. We don't purify ourselves in order to come to God—we come to God to be purified. God is the only one who can make us holy. And He offers this to sinners especially, because sinners who know they need forgiveness are the only ones to receive it. God never forces His mercy on anyone. He offers it to those who ask for it. And the amount of wine symbolizes the extent of God's mercy. As there was now more than enough wine for the wedding, God has more than enough mercy for those who need it. Wine is also a symbol of joy in the Old Testament. There is no greater joy than knowing that you have been forgiven by the Lord.

GREAT ADULT EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY!

Paul VI Institute of Catechetical and Pastoral Studies, which offers college-level courses to adults pursuing a greater understanding of the Catholic Church, will be accepting registration for spring classes. Paul VI, accredited by the Vatican Sacred Congregation of the Clergy, also offers a certificate of religious studies. The dates of the spring semester are **February 8—April 30, 2010. Deadline for registration is January 29, 2010 for all classes.**

This semester Paul VI will be offering a *new* "**Certificate of Medical Moral Catechesis.**" The purpose of the certificate is to prepare students to teach the Catholic principles and pastoral aspects of the medical moral life, covering medical and biotechnological issues. This certificate program is comprised of courses in the philosophical and theological understanding of the human person. It is open to all interested adults and consists of twenty credit hours.

Some of our NEW courses this semester are *Indiana Jones, the Tomb Raiders and the Real Archaeology of the Bible*, by Reverend Gregory Lockwood; *Christian Philosophy for Catechesis* by Dr. Randall Colton. We will also be offering a Spanish course on MT101: *Fundamentos de la Moralidad Catolica* by Reverend Carlos Roman, JCL, MA. Paul VI is also offering a workshop on Catechism III: *Life in Christ* on February 6, 2010 at Cardinal Rigali Center.

As long-time advocates of health care reform, the U.S. Catholic bishops continue to make the moral case that genuine health care reform must protect the life, dignity, consciences and health of all, especially the poor and vulnerable. Health care reform should not advance a pro-abortion agenda in our country.

- On November 7, the U.S. House of Representatives passed major health care reform that reaffirms the essential, longstanding and widely supported policy against using federal funds for elective abortions and includes positive measures on affordability and immigrants.
- On December 24, the U.S. Senate rejected this policy and passed health care reform that requires federal funds to help subsidize and promote health plans that cover elective abortions. All purchasers of such plans will be required to pay for other people's abortions through a separate payment solely to pay for abortion.
