*"Do This in Memory of Me."*

At the Last Supper when Jesus was about to say "goodbye" to His Apostles He asked them to "Do this in memory of Me." Instead of



saying goodbye He invited them into eternity. He asks us to recall His memory, to preserve it and to act—to do something. St. Paul's took this message to the Gentiles. When he made an appearance he attracted a lot of attention, "... almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord" (Acts 13:44). The word continued to be spread through the whole region, "the disciples were filled with joy" (52). John relates his vision of a great multitude, "every nation, race, people and tongue" (Rev. 7:9) and the Lamb who "will lead them to springs of life giving water" (Rev 7:17).

The Eucharistic Celebration leads us to works of charity and Christian witness. Even today we seek to usher in a time when "they will not hunger or thirst anymore" (Rev. 7:16). Through the Annual Catholic Appeal this message reaches people of all ages, all faiths, all social, ethnic and economic backgrounds in all neighborhoods of the Archdiocese. Through your participation your life is united with others in Christ.

## WHAT CATHOLICS WANT TO KNOW

Fourth Sunday of Easter C 1

Acts 13:14, 43-52

### God's Unstoppable Spirit

You cannot stop the Holy Spirit. The Spirit will flow and inspire, filling the earth beyond all borders. You cannot stop God's word.

They tried. The enemies of Paul and Barnabas tried to stop them from preaching. They tried to contain the message of the gospel. It did not work.

Paul and Barnabas, traveling on a missionary journey, spoke at a synagogue at Antioch in Pisidia. Many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism listened. By the following week the crowds were so large that the Jewish leaders of the city tried to stop the apostles from preaching. Paul and Barnabas simply preached to a wider audience. They no longer preached to Jews alone. Now they were preaching to Gentiles.

As Christianity continued to spread, the Jewish leaders started a persecution against Paul and Barnabas and expelled them from their territory. They did the only thing they could do. They went to another city. And they preached the gospel there.

If the Holy Spirit has a message, that message will be proclaimed. And if the message is within us, we will speak it. Not everyone is prepared to hear the message. Not everyone will receive its point. But the Spirit will speak.

When someone tries to keep you from saying what you know is important, the Spirit may be looking for a wider audience.

Once nominated, each nominee will be contacted to confirm their acceptance to be entered into a general drawing. The six new members will be selected and announced at the 10am Mass on May 2, 2010. The following provides a brief overview of who we are, what we do, and what is required.

### **History:**

The concept of a Parish Council was introduced into Parish life shortly after the Second Vatican Council. Underlying the structure of the Parish Council is the recognition of the rights and responsibility of all the baptized. It is participation in the ministry of the Church that allows the council to exist and provides a means for a shared and collaborative ministry. Parish Councils are a way for all members of the Church, priests and laity, by virtue of oneness in Jesus Christ to satisfy baptismal responsibilities. Our role as believers is to preach and teach the Gospel of Jesus to build the Kingdom of God on earth. As Catholics, we do this within a communal context - a Parish. The work of a Parish Council is the promotion of the mission of the Parish as well as that of the Church.

### **What is a Parish Council:**

Parish Council is a group of twelve individuals selected from the St. Clare membership at large that function as an advisory body to the pastor of a Parish. Parish Council promotes the mission of the Church by assisting with guidance on direction of how the Parish develops and responds to the Sacramental, educational and physical life of its members. The primary task is to be constructive and directive in the spiritual and faith-development of the Parish. They assist with consultation on major tasks and undertakings of the Parish with focus on various events to promote both Parish life and unity.

### **Accomplishments and Commitment:**

Over the past few years, there have been several issues and events undertaken by the St. Clare Parish Council. Below are a few of examples:

- Coordinating the yearly Parish Feast Day Celebration in August
- Designed and implemented St. Clare Facilities Usage Plan
- Coordinate and sponsor Doughnut Sundays program to build fellowship in the Parish
- Research and coordinate Parish Mission
- Goals and Objectives of the Parish

### **Commitment:**

The total commitment for Parish Council is a three year term. The commitment is the simple part because it only requires your time and talents. The time commitment for Parish Council varies depending on the issues and topics that one participates in throughout the year. The yearly commitment is on average 10 meetings per year that run approximately one to one and a half hours long. Involvement in the various activities throughout the year could require an additional 20 – 30 hours throughout the year.

### **MISSOURI CATHOLIC CONFERENCE ACTION ALERT — MISSOURI MUST RESPOND — KEEP ABORTION OUT OF HEALTH CARE REFORM:**

States Can Exclude Abortion Coverage Within Insurances Exchanges. The new federal law allows states to prohibit health insurance exchanges operating in their state from offering coverage for elective abortions. SB 747, sponsored by State Senator Scott Rupp (R-Wentzville) and HB 1725, sponsored by State Rep Darrell Pollock (R-Lebanon), would apply this abortion prohibition to Missouri.

Winter PSR registration is still open and we ask that you register or re-register this month.

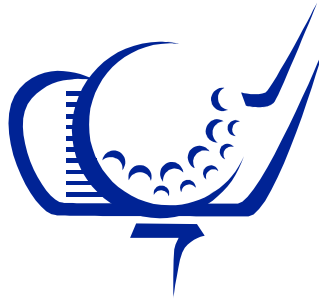
